An Advent Greeting from our Senior Pastor

When I was a young child, I witnessed things that I have never forgotten. For example, I vividly remember the first funeral I attended and the weight of sadness in the room from my community as one of my firstgrade friends passed away with childhood illness. I also still can hear the cars from a NASCAR race my Dad took me to at Bristol Speedway, for the roar of the engines ripped through my body. And, I remember the feel and the smell of the ocean the first time I saw it (which was a big deal being from the mountains). In witnessing things unfold before us, either good or bad, like or not, we are shaped by the moment.

Our Advent/Christmas theme that will shape our worship and devotional time this season is "I Witness – Living Inside the Story of Christmas." As a pastor, I must say that I have grown to worry that Christmas flows over and past us in the present age. In doing so, we often fail to witness God's plan and promises unfolding right before us.

My family saw the new Grinch movie recently with a family friend. I was reminded of the great saying from Dr. Seuss, "Maybe Christmas, the Grinch thought, doesn't come from a store." As the season is upon us, and we will witness both the good and the bad parts of it, the ultimate question is: How can we all plan to witness and share the witness of God's love coming near in Jesus once more? That witness is not bought. It is freely given and also meant to be freely shared.

This Christmas my prayer is that we witness the goodness of God and our place in the story of the gift of Jesus Christ. For our church, I pray that we each commit to share Christ, in our giving, in our celebrations and our invitations. There is so much opportunity to bear witness to something far greater than materialism or rampant consumerism this Christmas. The world needs your witness and mine.

Christmas in Bethlehem: An Eyewitness Account with Janet Lahr Lewis ~ 6:00 PM Wednesday, Dec. 19 in Rm 236



Janet is a recently retired missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church (GBGM). She lived in the Middle East from 1994 to 2014 during which time she served as Methodist Liaison in Palestine and Israel for the global Methodist Church, working to establish the

Methodist Liaison Office-Jerusalem, a partnership between GBGM, the Methodist Church of Britain, and the World Methodist Council. After her return to the US in 2014 she served as Advocacy Coordinator for the Middle East working with the General Board of Church and Society in Washington, DC. until her retirement in March 2018. After living in Bethlehem for 15 years Janet is now a member of FUMC.

As we prepare for visitors on Christmas Eve, here are some ideas that might make it easier for you to welcome others to our church. Feel free to come up with other ideas or adapt these on your own. These are just to get you thinking about welcoming as a personal ministry, right there in the pew, and a lifestyle for our church.

Circle of 10: Greet anyone, member or guest, who comes within ten feet of you. Make a special effort to greet the people you don't already know within your Circle of 10.

Rule of 3: Please do not talk to other members for the first three minutes after the service. Talk only to those you don't know or people you know are guests. It takes guests about three minutes to exit the church after worship and we need to make sure someone has made contact with them before they leave.

Don't know what to say to a guest?

Here are a few conversation starters:

1. Offer a handshake and say, "Hello. My name is _____, and you are ...?"

2. Wait for a response and repeat the person's name so you make sure that you get it right and so you can more easily remember it.

3. If you think you know the face but can't recall the name, try this approach: "Hello, I'm

______. I believe I've seen you here before but I don't know that we've had the opportunity to meet. What is your name?"

4. Don't be embarrassed if you're greeting a member and don't know that person's name—or be offended if someone doesn't remember yours.

We need to offer grace to one another, just as we would to new people. Don't forget to use our invites to invite someone to a Christmas Eve Service, or if you would like us to mail an invite, please us know by email carolknott@fumcva.org.

"The creche you see at FUMC comes from a long tradition in the Wilson family. Our mother loved Christmas, and for us it always started with putting up the creche. From a very simple scene when we were very young, as we grew the creche grew with us. One year our Uncle brought our mother a new set, with large beautiful figures. It had three kings, but no camels. One shepherd and two sheep. We found camel figurines, and painted them to match the set. We also found sheep at some point, and painted those too.. and so a tradition

was born: every year we would add something we had made to the creche. We made angels, waterfalls, mountains, caves... whatever we could dream up.

Four years ago our brother, Mike Wilson, got permission to put up our mothers creche at FUMC. When we heard about it, both sisters wanted to join in.. and we brought along a nephew to provide expertise. That was the only year we displayed the original figurines. Amazingly, soon after, our niece (Mike's daughter) one day saw a set of figurines just like the originals but painted in colors. Since then we have gathered each year to put up this creche at FUMC. We do it for love, in memory of our mother and of our traditions. We hope you enjoy it."
