## MISSION YOUTH

### **Summer Missions:**

We have three Youth mission trips planned for this summer. **Jeremiah Project** (6-8th grades); **Fred Camp** and **Carolina Cross Connection** (9th-[12th grades).

We would like to highlight a different mission trip each month, starting with FredCamp in April.

FredCamp began 20 years ago as a Christian youth workcamp repairing and renovating homes in the greater Fredericksburg area one week in July each year. Youth, aged 14 to 18, are eligible to attend. A crew of 5 youth and one adult go out to a home for a week to work on projects such as painting, floor replacement, wall repair, door repair, gutter replacement, outside painting, ramp building, and much more. Neither the youth nor the adults need to have experience because each site has a handy man to facilitate the work. In the evenings, there is a program with singing, Bible study, games, prayer, and testimonies. Since 1999, FredCamp has worked on 8-10 houses which translates to about 180 houses where FredCamp youth have touched the lives of needy folks in this area.

However, FredCamp is not about the houses! It is about the kids – about their faith journey and their relationship with God. The houses are a means by which the youth learn lifetime lessons. Each year we have 40-50 youth attend, and it is impossible to say how many that has been over the 20 years because many come back for 4 years before they graduate from high school. One former FredCamper's child will be attending FredCamp this year as a brand-new camper! FUMC will send 13 more youth to FredCamp this July.

Wherever they are, they have taken a little bit of their FredCamp lessons with them into their lives, and, we hope, they are serving God still.

Members of the Altar Guild planned, purchased and delivered Easter Baskets to the Thurman Brisben Homeless Shelter.

The Shelter currently has 30 children, 6 Preschoolers, 20 K-5 and 4 High Schoolers. 26 Easter Baskets and 4 Gift Bags were delivered to them.

To each premade basket that we purchased at Costco we added a chocolate cross and a \$10 Walmart gift card. We also gave them Easter books for the preschoolers and elementary children. The gift bags for the high schoolers included a chocolate Easter egg, chocolate cross and \$50 Walmart gift card. In addition we purchased 16 boxes of juice drinks and some bath towels that were on their needs list. They were very appreciative of the baskets and gift bags, especially since a group that was supposed to show up last Sunday and do an Easter Egg Hunt for the children failed to show up.


### CHILDREN


