

"Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible." (Hebrews 11:1-3, NRSV)

As a mom, I have gone through many cycles of getting kids ready for another school year. This past week, as our preschool began the year with parent orientation day, I was taken back to being a new, adoptive mom reluctantly taking my girls to hand over to the care of someone else. It was a wonderful, Christian preschool we had selected for them, and I had done all the right mom things in researching all the area schools, with visits and priority lists. Once we made the selection of school, I packed all the necessary supplies into new little backpacks

for their journey of that first school year. They had new shoes, snuggly hand-made nap blankets, sturdy new lunch boxes and all the other provisions, e.g., pencils, crayons, washable markers, notebooks. Bert and I did our best to prepare them for that first school experience, including all the little "teachable moments" of counsel to Kayana and Danielle about how the year would be (we did this for Trae, too, but he was entering 3rd grade that year, so at least he knew about school).



What I learned from that experience was that the work in preparation was the easy part. In those early days of leaving them, the hard part was letting go of little hands and walking away. I had done what I could, and then I had to trust that God was at work in their lives, the lives of the teaching staff and the environment where they were each day. Honestly, as I prepare for starting new schools again this coming week, I feel a bit the same. The new shoes are bigger now and the backpacks require more, but there is still a trust of God at work, when I let go. There is a Jewish proverb that says: "God could not be everywhere, and therefore he made mothers." However, as a mother, I have learned that I truly have to "let go and let God" even when it is hard. So many other things in life require this as well, which are steps in faith and trust of God.



School Dressing Days 2018

The Interfaith Community Council (ICC), of which our church is a member along with more than 20 other faith communities, sponsors School Dressing Days every August. This event in some form has been held for over 40 years in Fredericksburg to assist students who need help getting ready to start the new school year. We serve students in Fredericksburg, Stafford, Spotsylvania, King George and Caroline Counties, from Kindergarten through 12th grade and also children accepted into Head Start. Each student receives a backpack, basic school supplies, toiletries, new socks and underwear, jeans and a shirt. Gently used outerwear and shoes may also be available. FUMC members support School Dressing Days through their financial gifts, donations of clothing and other items, and by volunteering their time through the year preparing for the event and by serving at School Dressing Days itself.

This years event served 1,241 children just a few weeks ago!

week. VBS kids, Adult Sunday School Classes, Church Families, you are amazing. Thank you for supporting our youth in their local summer mission.


Important safety reminders!

FACE TO FACE ENCOUNTER

In August, we hosted the first Face to Face Encounter in the Fredericksburg area. Face to Face is a Walk to Emmaus kind of experience for people over the age of 60 that takes place over 4 days. We had 24 "pilgrims" who attended the 4 days and 29 team members that led the Encounter. Combined, the team and pilgrims came from 22 different churches from as far away as the Northern Neck and Lynchburg. The average age of our pilgrims was 76. One man who was 89 had a 1 and ½ hour drive one way to come to the Encounter. He said it was the best 3 hours he ever spent to be there. Twenty years ago, he wife had walked, and he was thrilled to be able to come to Face to Face himself. Since Face to Face is for both men and women, we had several couples attend the Encounter. One man had been wanting to take the Walk to Emmaus for several years but couldn't leave his wife alone for 3 days. Both he and his wife came to Face to Face.

Some of our pilgrims were widows and widowers and seemed to enjoy the conversation at the tables and having a meal with others. One woman remarked that it was the best sandwich she had had in a long time; though, I bet it was mostly the people and the conversation that were the best.

After just 2 days of the Encounter, the daughter of one of the pilgrims contacted us and said she wanted to sign up for the Walk to Emmaus in November. Perhaps her mother's response to Face to Face was what helped the daughter realize she wanted to participate too.

The most amazing part of the Encounter was God's presence with us, surrounding us, leading us, and speaking to us throughout the 4 days. The lives of 24 pilgrims were touched by our Encounter with Christ. Thank you church for hosting Face to Face Encounter #1.




