I have heard this question at least one hundred times in church leader training sessions over recent years. Unfortunately, the training dialogue that goes with the question is usually focused on bringing to awareness the fact that many churches could cease to be open and not much would happen differently in the world.

On the last Sunday of September, our church membership was asked during our 5Th Sunday Connect to write a one-word description of Fredericksburg United Methodist Church. I know, a very hard task! The word-graphic you see on this page gives summary of the answers we received. **Family** was by far the most frequently used word, followed by **home** and **love**.



I was struck deeply in looking over the full list. So much would be lost if we were not here, and this is just a sampling of our members' responses. What would the community in Guatemala we served this summer write? If given pen, what would we hear from a family who receives regular food from our food pantry? How might an attendee of our

Narcotics Anonymous group reflect on the place we provide for her each week?

Contemporary theologian, Stanley Hauerwas, states: "The heart of the gospel is that you don't know Jesus without the witness of the church. It's always mediated." Gift Annuity—A Win, Win for You And FUMC

In our retirement years, many of us worry whether we are going to have enough money to take care of ourselves and not be dependent on others during our lifetime. And, many of us yearn in our declining years to have the satisfaction of knowing that our Church will have a secure financial future long after we have passed on.

Are these conflicting motivations? Not necessarily. In fact, they can be complementary by purchasing a gift annuity through the Virginia United Methodist Foundation. Dedicated, deceased FUMC members have already paved the way with the residuals of the gift annuities going to the Fredericksburg United Methodist Foundation.

Many elderly have seen their financial situation worsen in recent years by experiencing returns on fixed income investments that barely keep pace with inflation. Current gift annuity rates—even when purchased at age 60 and two life—provide guaranteed lifetime returns that exceed most fixed income investments available in the open market. Check out the chart below for examples that took effect July 1, 2018.

The Virginia United Methodist Foundation points out that there are other advantages in purchasing a gift annuity: An income tax charitable deduction the year you purchase the annuity, A portion of the annuity payments are tax free for your life expectancy, and The partial elimination of capital gains tax when you use appreciated asserts to fund an annuity.

The Fredericksburg United Methodist Foundation was organized nearly 20 years ago by the FUMC Church Council as a 501(c3) corporation to administer funds to carry out FUMC missions. Its Board is appointed by the Church Council and the Senior Pastor is a voting ex officio member,. During the current calendar year, the Foundation Board has made over \$47,000 in disbursements to support FUMC missions. All FUMF assets are invested through the Conference Foundation.

A named fund requires a gift of at least \$20,000, and the benefactor can designate the purpose for which the proceeds are to be used.

Health Services Navigator

The Health Services Navigator is a full-time salaried position at Micah's Respite house, which is an eight-bed group home for homeless individuals who are recovering from a recent hospital stay. Responsibilities include receiving referrals, providing follow-up care, and connecting guests to supports necessary to address their health challenges and stabilize their lives. How does love come down for Prison Fellowship Angel Tree children and their families served by FUMC?

Yes, we do provide Christmas gifts for these children whose parents are incarcerated, but our focus is much broader than becoming a substitute Santa. Earlier this year, we committed to serving seventy-five Prison Fellowship children. As soon as we receive our children at the end of October, we begin contacting caregivers to verify each child's name and birthdate, to explain this ministry, and to begin the process of obtaining specific gift suggestions.

Love becomes evident in the ways we reach and respect caregivers. Having detailed information about every gift requested is essential if a gift to be just what each child hoped for or needed! Preparing the Angel tags provides another chance to love and to help restore a relationship when we include a special message to each child from the incarcerated parent.

Once the gifts have been purchased and returned to the church wrapped, elves insure that all gifts are readied for delivery. Age-appropriate religious booklets for each child and caregiver, as well as a special invitation for the family to attend Christmas events and services at FUMC, will accompany every delivery.

Church families will have an opportunity to share God's love when they greet a caregiver with these gifts. Love comes down at FUMC before even a single present is unwrapped!
